



# PET FIRST AID KIT

## VETERINARIAN-RECOMMENDED SUPPLIES

- **Emergency telephone numbers**

- **Adhesive Tape**
- **Alcohol prep pads** *Use to clean scissors, tweezers, and hands. Do not use on wounds.*
- **Baby dose syringe** *For flushing wounds.*
- **Cloth strips** *Cut approximately 2 inches x4 feet long, the strips can be used to secure an injured animal to a board for transport to a veterinarian.*
- **Cotton balls, swabs**
- **Elastic bandage**
- **Eye wash** *Read and follow individual package directions provided on bottle.*
- **Duct tape** *Place several strips on a water bottle or plastic container for various uses in emergencies.*
- **Flexible wrap** *Used to wrap and stabilize injuries. Adheres to itself, no clips or tape needed. DO NOT wrap so tightly that circulation is cut off.*
- **Gauze pads and bandages** *Use to clean, cover and cushion injured areas. Gauze rolls can also be used to make a temporary muzzle.*
- **Gloves (both leather and latex)** *Protects hands and prevents contamination of open wounds, burns, and abrasions.*
- **Hand sanitizer**
- **Hydrogen peroxide** *Use to induce vomiting only when instructed by a veterinarian or the ASPCA poison control center. Not recommended for use on skin.*
- **Muzzle** *Even the most loving animal may bite if stressed, injured, or sick.*
- **Multi-purpose tool**
- **Nylon leash & harness**
- **Pediatric rectal thermometer**
- **Petroleum or water based lubricant**
- **Povidone-iodine solution** *Provides antiseptic action in the prevention of infection in burns, lacerations and abrasions.*
- **Scissors** *For cutting tape and gauze and to clip hair around wounds.*
- **Styptic powder or pencil** *A clotting agent to stop bleeding.*
- **Tweezers**
- **Towel** *Small travel towel works well.*
